# Will education get the funds it needs in 2005?

The start of a new year brings transformation — people are making New Year's resolutions, accountants are preparing to file taxes, the president will be inaugurated for his second

In accordance with the onset of the year 2005, budgets are also created and implemented. The 2005 budget for education increases federal education funding to \$57.3 billion. That's 36 percent higher than when President George W. Bush first took office.

On paper, this proposition appears to be a step in the right direction for education, especially since money has been stripped from this sector at an exponential rate over the past four years.

This new budget affects California in several ways. First and foremost, federal funding for California increases to \$11.5 billion, 45 percent more than four years ago. An additional \$3.2 billion is provided to help California implement the changes of No Child Left Behind.

President Bush signed the No Child Left Behind act on Jan. 8, 2002. The objective is to give schools stronger educational reform based on:

- ◆Stronger accountability for results
- ◆More freedom for states and communities
- ◆Encouraging proven education methods and more choices for parents.

The intent with No Child Left Behind is to give each child quality education and the knowledge and tools to move on to the next grade level. The act designates that children should have smaller classroom sizes during elementary education and teachers should hold specific subject credentials and only teach those subjects.

Unfortunately, No Child Left Behind seems to cause more detriment than hope when looking at the state of education over the past two

California charter schools are obtaining \$75 million as a result of Rod Paige, U.S. Secretary of Education, declaring a three-year federal grant intending to aid the creation of 250 charter schools by the year 2007.

Reports compiled by both state and federal officials announce that 56 percent of the county's public schools have a higher academic rating than previous years. Federal academic goals were met by 68 percent of these schools. Within the state of California, 64 percent of schools improved their state ratings while satisfying all federal targets.

Being told our schools are getting better is promising. However, take a look at the percentages. In most classrooms, when students earn percentages of 56, 68 and 64, they are failing. Students are considered average when they master between 70 and 80 percent. Once they acquire between 80 and 100 percent, then students are commended for their achievement.

Although apparently moving in the right direction, the state and government need to improve their percentages.

May the year 2005 bring happiness, success and peace to everyone.
